### Nationally Ranked Cancer Program Seeks Sarcoma Clinical Research Physician

To foster further development of solid tumor oncology, The Ohio State University Comprehensive Cancer Center – Arthur G. James Cancer Hospital and Richard J. Solove Research Institute has created an independent Division of Medical Oncology within the Department of Internal Medicine. This new division, currently with 24 faculty, is seeking clinical and translational researchers specializing in sarcoma. Candidates for this position will demonstrate a strong background in clinical trials enrollment, a focus on aggressively treating sarcoma, a team orientation and a background in basic research that will facilitate translational research. This position joins a well rounded team of specialists with a connection to basic scientists throughout the university. This well functioning team that includes pathologists, radiologists, radiation oncologists, surgical oncologists and orthopedic oncologists, meets regularly to discuss patient care and research interests. The successful candidate will participate actively with this group.
